Julie Cryer sat across the formica table in the Yorkshire Post canteen and fixed her irridescent gaze on me. Averting my eyes to look out across the Leeds rooftops, touched by pale spring sunshine, I felt unnerved – as would perhaps anyone in the presence of someone who claims to be able to see everything about you, 'like watching a video', past, present and future.

does everyone I deal with."

Some of Julie's clients are very famous, she's told me their names, but I'm sworn to secrecy. Many are involved in the music industry, others in the media, still others in television. "Some years ago, I met Mark Addy in a pub up near YTV. He'd just been for an audition, and I told him he hadn't got the part, but not to worry, he'd be a Hollywood sex symbol in a couple of years.

"Of course, he was incredulous!" she grinned, as a chill ran down my spine. "But then three years later, he got a part in *The Full Monty.*" Strange but true, and Julie's conversation is peppered with similar accounts. It is no wonder that she has such a huge client base. "Do you ever feel that your gift is a burden?" I ask. "Never a burden, but a responsibility, yes. Obviously, I can't tell everyone that they're going to get a part in a Hollywood blockbuster, but what I can do is show people the bigger picture – I can inspire people to better themselves. I love to inspire people."

Things have certainly changed as far as people's perceptions of mediums are concerned. Nowadays, people are more open to alternative practices, and many have great faith in them. "The adults of today are more interested in what's out there, they're less held back. People today have massive amounts of freedom compared to previous generations, and they are sometimes unsure what to do with their freedom. By talking to me, they can gain reassurance and confirmation," she said.

"I find that my client base has changed significantly – more men and more intelligent people. I've started doing corporate clairvoyancy with a couple of businesses in the Yorkshire area. I find this very exciting and a lot of fun. And of course, the companies I'm working for are really thrilled!"

Julie has a number of projects lined up for the next few years, a film and even a book. "I want to call it *Spiritually Speaking...* we don't have to be called Doris, because it will be all about the changing face of clairvoyancy."
